All qualified exhibits must be ridden into the ring. However, if a rider has qualified more than one horse, that rider will be allowed, if they wish, to exchange horses and ride each horse for its individual display. 38. OBJECTIONS

Objections under AHS Rules must be made in writing and submitted to the Show Director or Show Secretary by AHS Members only, within one hour of the end of the class, or the occurrence to which exception has been taken. Objections must be accompanied by a deposit of £50 (cheques made payable to the AHS) which will be forfeited if the objection be deemed frivolous or vexatious. The result of any investigation should be concluded within twenty-one days. Breaches of AHS rules will be reported to the Shows and Events Committee by Panel Judges and/or organisers of affiliated shows. If a case is deemed by the Judge and/or the Show Organiser as too serious to be settled on the day, it can be referred to the Shows and Events Committee of the Arab Horse Society for settlement. Penalties will be applied after examination of any breach of the AHS Rules. Penalties will be published in the Society Newsletter, as will details of infringements.

39. APPEALS

Appeals against the final decision must be made within 14 days.

ECAHO Classes

Entries in ECAHO classes are subject to the 2009 rules of ECAHO. Exhibitors are encouraged to make themselves fully aware of these as by signing the Classic Show entry form they are declaring their acceptance of such rules. They can be viewed and downloaded from:

(Go to Download Area, Blue Book 2009)

Copies will be viewable at The Classic Show office on show day. CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The Champion (Gold) will be chosen from the first placed horses and the Reserve Champion (Silver) will be selected from the other first placed horses, plus the horse placed second to the Champion. A Reserve to the Reserve (Bronze) will be selected (using the same system used to select the Reserve) and receive a rosette.

19. SHOW HALTERS

Stallions and colts aged three years and over must be shown wearing bridles and bits which are both secure and comfortable for the horse. All bridles without bits are equally to be both secure and comfortable for the horse. Bridles and bits must not be so thin as to cause pain to the horse. Foals must be suitably haltered without chains. Solid metal nosebands and headpieces are not allowed.

20. WHIPS

Whips used in In Hand classes must not have attachments fastened to them.

21. HANDLERS

Only one handler allowed per exhibit in the ring at any one time. Handlers may not exchange horses, except in mare and foal classes and in Championships where, if a handler has qualified more than one horse, he may trot both of them up. No handler may leave the ring without the permission of the judge via the steward. 22. If a handler removes a horse without the permission of the judge or steward the show organiser will levy a £100 fine on the handler. The exhibitor will be ultimately responsible for ensuring payment.

SPECIFIC TO RIDDEN

23. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

No person shall be mounted on a horse on the showground unless he/she is wearing a correctly fitting hard hat. The AHS strongly recommends that hats conform to the standards EN1384 or PAS 015 and are correctly fitted with chinstraps. This is compulsory for anyone under 18 and for anyone taking part in Show-jumping classes.

24. Spurs must not be worn in Novice classes.

<u>A Novice horse is one that has not been placed first three times under saddle (prior to the start of the current season) and or has never qualified for HOYs. Horses competing in the UK for their first season under saddle are only deemed a novice if they have not been ridden in open ridden classes abroad. (NEW RULE FOR 2009)</u>

25. Whips used in Ridden classes must not exceed 75cms (30ins).

26. Ridden class exhibits must wear conventional and well maintained English tack. The judge may refuse to ride or judge a horse if he/ she deems the tack to be unsafe or unsuitable.

27. Horses entered in ridden classes must be 4 years old or over. Age is calculated from the 1st January each year. (e.g. a foal becomes a yearling on the first day of January following that of its birth).

28. The class as a whole should be ridden and not judged from the ground; the exception being any pony that the judge considers too small to ride which must be asked for an individual show. If the judge chooses not to ride a pony, this decision should be made at the commencement of the class and communicated to all the exhibitors, so that they clearly understand the position from the outset of the class. Individual shows will be required in Championships.

29. Young Rider Classes - restricted to riders who are 18 years and under on the first day of the show. The judge will not ride any of the exhibits. The horses will give a short individual show and be placed on their performance and the ability of the rider. The winners of these classes will not be eligible for the Championships.

30. HOYS qualifiers. If a class is split the top four from each section will ride off. The HOYS qualification will go to the highest placed, previously unqualified horse in the top four in the ride-off.

31. Any rider falling off within the show ring during the course of a class will be disqualified and asked to leave the ring dismounted.

32. If a rider removes a horse from the ring without the permission of the judge or steward the show organiser will levy a £100 fine on the rider. The exhibitor will be ultimately responsible for ensuring payment.

33. In ridden classes, a horse's manners are important and Judges should refuse to ride unmannerly, unschooled or dangerous horses.

34. Horses must be trained to stand quietly to be mounted. Judges may choose to use a mounting block.

35. Any horse in a ridden class which behaves in a manner which could cause, or result in danger or injury to any other horse or person in the ring, will be ordered to leave by the Steward on instructions from the judge of that class.

2009 QUALIFIERS

<u>This show will be conducted in accordance with the Show Rules and</u> <u>regulations of The Arab Horse Society and ECAHO</u>



ECAHO National "C" Show—entries must be registered by AHS.

The English or Comparative judging system will be used with one judge judging the horses by comparing and ranking them.

ECAHO International Qualifiers

Qualifications for an A-Show (UKIAHS): 1st placed horses in a class of three horses; 1st and 2nd placed horses in a class of four to five horses; 1st to 3rd in a class of six or more horses. (This excludes foal classes). First placed horses are qualified for participating at the European Championships and/or the Middle East Championship.

Title Show and A Show Champion Gold medal winners are not allowed to take part for the rest of that calendar year and the two calendar years following, unless the horse has passed from a junior to a senior category.

10. INTERFERENCE

Exhibitors will not encourage their horses or ponies in any sort of dangerous behaviour. They will not interfere with another competitor's horse or its performance. The judge is empowered to order any exhibit to be disqualified if he considers that the exhibit or handler has breached the rule.

11. BEHAVIOUR

a. Unruly horses may be ordered to withdraw at the judge's discretion.

b. If a horse becomes loose in the show ring the owner may be required to pay a fine to the organiser. Should the horse become loose a second time it will be disqualified.

c. Deliberate baiting in the ring of a competitor's horse will not be tolerated.

d. MISUSE OF DRUGS It is forbidden to administer any stimulant, sedative, masking agent, antiinflammatory agent (including phenylbutazone and irritants) or substance, other than a normal nutrient to a horse or to cause one to be administered in any way whatsoever or to show or attempt to show a horse, which is found to have had administered to it any such stimulant, sedative or substance, whether intentionally or unintentionally, which may affect performance, appearance, temperament or soundness. Such forbidden substances are listed in Appendix IV, FEI Veterinary Regulations.

The Society reserves the right to cause to be carried out at any show, tests in accordance with the Standard Sampling Procedure prescribed in the Veterinary Rules of the F.E.I. Refusal to submit a horse for the taking of a sample for analysis shall constitute a breach of this rule. Anyone found to be in breach of this rule would be subject to disciplinary action and in the event of a positive test liable to pay administration costs.

12. SOUNDNESS

Exhibits which appear to be lame may be asked to withdraw at the judge's discretion.

13. EXAMINATION

Judges may require handlers to open horses' mouths or pick up their feet for inspection.

14. JUDGES Exhibitors will not associate with judges immediately before or at any time during the show. Judges will not consult the catalogue at any time before or during the show.

15. ANNOUNCEMENTS

No announcements of names of horses, exhibitors or handlers may be made until the completion of the class in which they appear.

16. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Exhibitors will not exhibit under judges where an actual or apparent conflict of interest may affect the judge's decision. Organisers will not accept entries that indicate any connection listed under this rule. An actual or apparent conflict of interest is defined as exhibiting a horse which:

a. has been bought or sold by the judge either as owner or agent.

b. is owned in whole or part by the judge or by a member of the judge's family or business partner in a business venture.

c. has been bred by the judge or is the property of a breeding organisation in which the judge is an employee.

d. has been leased by the judge at any time.

e. has been regularly trained, examined or treated by the judge in a professional capacity.

f. has been shown/produced by a member of the judge's immediate family.

g. An exhibitor/owner must not enter any horse under a judge the same calendar year in which that judge has professionally handled, shown or produced that or any other horse for that exhibitor/owner.

h. If a handler produces or shows a judge's own horse, that handler must not bring any horse under that judge in the same calendar year.

17. AWARDS

If an exhibit is not up to the required standard, a lower award may be given at the judge's discretion.

SPECIFIC TO IN HAND

18. LATENESS

Exhibits which appear late (missing the walk around the ring) will be excluded from the class.

THE ARAB HORSE SOCIETY RULES FOR SHOWING 2009

All affiliated Shows are bound by the Rules below All 'C' Shows are bound by ECAHO 2009 and AHS Rules

Members of the Society, by paying their membership, agree to abide by the Rules of the Society.

1 ELIGIBILITY

All exhibits in ridden and In Hand classes, with the exception of foals at foot accompanied by their own dam, must be registered in the appropriate Stud Book/Register of The Arab Horse Society, by the closing date for entries

No alterations or substitutions of any entry will be allowed after the final closing date of entries. a STALLIONS

Stallions must be four years old and over.

b. MARES

Mares which are entered for classes for mares without foal at foot must not be entered for brood mare classes.

c. FOALS

No brood mare or her foal may be shown in any class unless the foal is at least 30 days old on the day of judging

2. DEFINITION OF AMATEUR STATUS

a. Handler or Rider not to have been paid for showing or producing any horse for a third party, this includes any remuneration either as employment, casual showing, or any in-kind benefits whatsoever.

b. Horse not to have resided on a professional yard on show or training livery in current year.

c. Horse not to have been shown by a professional in current year.

d. Horse not to have received regular training from a professional in current year.

3. DRESS

Handlers must be neat and tidy. In the interests of safety traditional in hand showing or riding clothes are preferred. No form of advertising may be displayed by the handler or on his horse in the ring. 4. INCIVILITY

Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any judge, steward or show official on the part of the exhibitor, groom, rider, agent or their respective companion of an animal will, at the discretion of the show, disgualify that animal from being judged in which case entry fees and prizes will be forfeited.

5. TIMETABLE

Classes will not start earlier than the advertised time unless all the entries are present. 6. CHAMPIONSHIPS

First and second prize winners are eligible. Class winner rosettes must be displayed.

All prize-winners eligible must take part in their respective championships and failure to do so may result in disgualification and removal of awards. In certain special cases only permission may be granted by the Show Organiser for exhibits to miss the championship.

7 TRIMMING AND CLIPPING

Pure Bred Arabians - Tactile hair must not be removed

All exhibits - Hair must not be shaved or otherwise removed from around horse's eyes. Eyelashes must be left uncut. Complete removal of the hair from inside the ear is forbidden. No alteration to the natural colour of the coat, skin or hooves is permitted. Clipping of foals is not permitted. Foals should be shown in their natural state.

It is recommended that the use of oils and clear make-up on horses exhibiting in the show ring is kept to a minimum. A judge may disgualify a horse, who in their opinion is wearing excessive make-up and /or oils. 8. CRUELTY

Excessive whipping, use of electric shock devices or infliction of pain by any means is forbidden in all parts of the showground, or stable areas, at all times.

9. OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE

Attempting to influence the behaviour of exhibits in the ring by rattling tins, banging on the side of the ring, etc., is forbidden.

- An amateur is defined under The Classic Show Rules: That "they" (Owners/Handlers/Riders) do not make a living, OR receive remuneration, in any form, for Producing/Handling/Riding horses or ponies for the show ring.



- Horse not to have been professionally shown in 2009; not to have received regular training by a visiting professional in 2009; not to have resided as show or training livery on a professional yard for 2009.
- Participants will not be eligible for ECAHO 2009 qualifications.
- Amateur/Home produced classes will be split as appropriate if well subscribed.

Equifest Showing Show

This show is affiliated to the Equifest Showing Show taking place at the East of England Showground on the 20th-23rd August 2009. The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

<u>Ridden Part Breds</u>

Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exhibits in this section must be registered in the Part Bred section of their respective Breed Society. Registration numbers must be stated on the entry form. Horses and ponies will not be ridden at the final.

<u>Ridden Piebald/Skewbald</u>

Open ridden Piebald/Skewbald stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Rider any age.

The Classic Show Rules

This show is run under AHS and ECAHO Rules which take precedent.

1. Conditions of Entry: All exhibits must be registered in their respective Stud Books.

Pure Bred Arabians must be registered in the AHS Studbook. Part-Bred Arabs to have a minimum of 12.5% blood to be eligible to compete. 2. Entries: Must be made in writing—completing the information as requested. Forms for entry will be found enclosed with the entry schedule. All entries must be signed and forwarded to the Secretary by the closing date of entry. *No late entries can be accepted for ECAHO classes.* Correct Entry Fees must accompany entry form. Any number of entries may be made upon the payment of the appropriate fee in accordance with the schedule for each class. The Committee may at their discretion refuse to accept any entry, the entry together with the fee will be returned and no correspondence will be entered into with regard to the nonacceptance. There will be no refunds on entry fees. Only the nominated animal may enter the ring for judging. It is sometimes unavoidable that competitors may find that their classes clash, if this should occur then it is up to the individual competitor to choose which class they compete in.

3. Correctness of Entry: Every exhibitor is responsible for the correctness of his/her entry, if when called upon to prove its correctness and the exhibitor fails to do so the entry may be cancelled or if already accepted disqualified.

4. Judges Interest: Competitors are requested to note the name of the Judge appointed in the particular classes in which they wish to enter and are advised in the interest of all concerned not to knowingly enter an animal which has been owned or bred by the judge. Where the judge has a continuing business interest or a financial relationship with an exhibitor he/she should not judge an animal entered by that exhibitor whether or not the animal concerned forms part of that business relationship. Where the judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in an animal he/she should not judge it. In such cases the Ring Steward in conjunction with the Chief Steward will make arrangements for the exhibit to be finally placed by another judge.

5. Substitution of Judges: The Committee reserve the right to change the identity of the judge for any classes from the one previously announced.

6. Age of Exhibits: Horses/Ponies in ridden classes must be 4 years of age or over. Foals entering any ring must be a minimum of 30 days old on the day of the show.

7. Alteration of Classes: The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate or split any classes in the event of their being insufficient or over-subscribed entries. 9. Championships: It is a condition of entry that All first and second prizewinners will take part in the appropriate Championships, unless otherwise stated in the catalogue. It is the exhibitors responsibility to be present for final judging. Failing to present may result in disqualification and all awards and placings being null and void. Exhibits under veterinary certification will be excused.

10. Trophies: Each Champion and Reserve Champion will receive an *Equuseye* trophy to keep.

11. Protests & Disputes: Any exhibitor wishing to lodge a protest against any other exhibitor must do so at The Show Secretary's Office within 30 minutes of the end of the class or the incident occurring. A written protest must be accompanied by the appropriate fee (£25). If a protest involves breaches of Arab Horse Society Rules and is submitted for action under those same rules then a fee of (£50) shall be required and the protest will be submitted to The Arab Horse Society under their Rules. Any fee submitted may be forfeited if the protest/Dispute is considered frivolous or vexatious. Any dispute as to the interpretation of the rules or any matters arising out of infringements or protests lodged by an exhibitor of The Classic Show shall be submitted to The Committee of the show for settlement whose decision shall be final and binding.

<u>12. HEALTH and SAFETY</u>: The organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

13. Exhibitors Risk and Responsibility: Neither the show venue owners, servants, nor the show Officers or Servants shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstance whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or to any exhibit or to any vehicle carrying any exhibit or anything else brought onto the showground or for anything else arising out of the Classic Arabian Horse Show. EACH EXHIBITOR is solely responsible for any consequential or other loss/injury or damage done to or commissioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the Show Organisers/Venue Owners against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. It is therefore the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure they have adequate insurance cover in place.

16. Medical/Veterinary/Farrier: Owners/Exhibitors shall be responsible for any/all costs/fees for services of these practitioners.

17. Passes: Spectators and vehicles will be admitted Free of Charge. No Horse box passes are required, but we request that all parking directions from either stewards or signs be obeyed.

18. Dogs: All dogs MUST be on a lead on the showground—Dogs are not permitted in the indoor arenas/indoor seating areas/or catering/bar areas. If this may be a problem please leave your dogs at home. Thank you.
